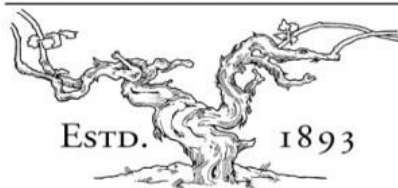

2013 Barbera d'Anunda

Grape Variety: 100% Barbera

Vineyard Soils: Red brown earth / sandy loam over red clay

Vine Age: Barbera planted 2005

GI: Barossa Valley

Summary:

Barbera is a well-known Italian grape variety. Barbera d'Anunda takes its name from its home town appellation, Tanunda, in the Barossa Valley, and its un-canny similarities with Barbera d'Alba – the famous appellation for Barbera in the Piedmont, Italy. A play on words, but the variety is true to Australian Barbera character.

Vinification:

Fruit was hand-picked, put to open fermenters and hand plunged four times per day for two weeks. Maturation was in 2 & 3 year old French barriques for 10 months. No fining or filtration

ALC 12.5 % **pH** 3.39 **TA** 6.72 g/l

Tasting Note:

Colour: Bright garnet core with rim displaying vivid cherry hues.

Nose: Lifted floral notes and red berries.

Palate: Supple and elegant palate with fine tannins – a medium weighted drink. Vibrant and fresh with lots of bright red berries & Satsuma plums mixed with savoury notes of spice such as fennel and cardamom.

Notes: You can enjoy this wine chilled in hot weather. Cellaring 5-8 years
